What is Hepatitis A?

- Hepatitis A is a highly contagious, short-term liver infection caused by the hepatitis A virus It can make you very sick and lead to hospitalizations and sometimes death.
- Hepatitis means inflammation of the liver. When the liver is inflamed or damaged, its function can be affected.

Hepatitis A is Preventable

Vaccine Schedule:

2 doses

- 1st dose- as early as 12 months old
- and dose- at least 6 months after dose #1
